

EASTER EGGS: NO NEED TO SHELL OUT

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THE international community may be worried about the price of cocoa and chocolate, but South Africans can still enjoy their Easter eggs without breaking the budget.

This despite the price of cocoa, a key ingredient in chocolate, having increased due to the political un-

rest in the Ivory Coast, a major cocoa producer. In Britain the price of Easter eggs has gone up by as much as 140%, reports a British daily. In Hilton, Quarry Spar says Easter eggs cost an average only R2 more than last year.
